

<u>Out of Bounds</u> Whatever happened to the NBA tradition?

There were both positive and negative signs in the 2000 NBA All-Star game this past weekend that give NBA fans a sense of where the league is headed this century. The high-flying, quick-paced action of the league's new stars is enough to keep fans in the seats of many arenas throughout this country, and now, even Canada (with the emergence of Vince Carter in Toronto). However, the way the media is portraying these young stars is a disgrace to the players before them, who made the league what it is today.

This issue is something new for the NBA, who has always kept and respected the tradition of the league's original stars. The league has always made sure that young players thank earlier generations of players, who laid down the foundation for one of this country's most popular sports.



So when Karl Malone threatened to sit out this year's All-Star game because of the younger players that were gleaming in the spotlight of the vultures that we call "the media," it sent a message to the entire league that the prided history of the NBA was being quickly forgotten.

One example...Vince Carter - 2nd year, slam-dunk star on a team with a 26-21 record is surrounded by 36

reporters. A couple yards away sits Bird, a legend by himself, and led on John Stockton - all-time NBA assist and steal leader, multiple All-Star Game appearances, considered greatest point guard of all time on a team with a 29-18 record, surrounded by...6. Just 6 reporters, not even enough for each reporter to match each assist that Stockton averages per game. 8.6 assists per game (4th in the NBA)...6 reporters. What an insult.

I don't blame Stockton's teammate Malone for the threat. You have a league that is trying to establish a more exciting image with younger stars at a time when the most successful teams in the league are led by veterans.

Entries: deadline is Friday, February 18, at 4:00 p.m. Entry Fee: \$2.00 will be charged to your student account Divisions: Coed only


Tournament: Round robin for each league. Top two teams from each league will advance to a single elimination championship bracket.
