The Yankees won their ninth straight American League East title on Tuesday.

That leaves six spots available, just three in each league. With a six and a half game lead going into Thursday's action, the Athletics had all but wrapped up the A.L. West. The Cardinals shared a similar position in the N.L. Central with a seven game lead over the Reds. Barring a major breakdown by either the Cardinals or A's, these divisions appear to be set.

Arguably the most up and down division all year has been the N.L. West. The Padres held a razor thin half game lead over the Dodgers on Thursday. The Dodgers have been on a roller coaster ride of winning and losing streaks, sending the team above and below the .500 mark all season. The Padres stumbled after the All-Star break, erasing the gains they had achieved in May and June, only to heat up again in September. The Dodgers have the advantage of schedule going into the last week with all of their remaining games against sub-.500 teams. The Padres play three of their last ten games against the Cardinals.

The Phillies are twelve games above .500 for August and September and find themselves playing for the N.L. Wild Card after a dismal first half of the season. They are tied with the Dodgers for the last spot in the N.L. playoffs, but have to play the young but talented Florida Marlins in six of their remaining ten games. This will make it harder for the Phillies to win the Wild Card, and almost guarantee the second place finisher in the West a spot in the playoffs.

On the American League side the remaining two spots are all but sewn up for the Central division. With only ten games left to play, the Twins have a commanding five and a half game lead over Central division rival White Sox, and eight and a half games over the third place Angels virtually guaranteeing the Wild Card will go to the second place team in the A.L. Central.

The real question is who will finish in first place in the Central. Anyone who said in April that the Tigers would be in first place with only ten games remaining would have been derided as delusion or stupid. The Tigers, however, have been in first place since May 21, and, with a huge win in their last series over the White Sox, have all but clinched a postseason berth. The Twins stumbled in April, but have been hot ever since and now trail the Tigers by just half a game. Both teams have been successful due to strong pitching. Heading into the last week of the season the Tigers have an easier schedule, but a lack of offensive performance will send this race down to the wire.
