KARATE

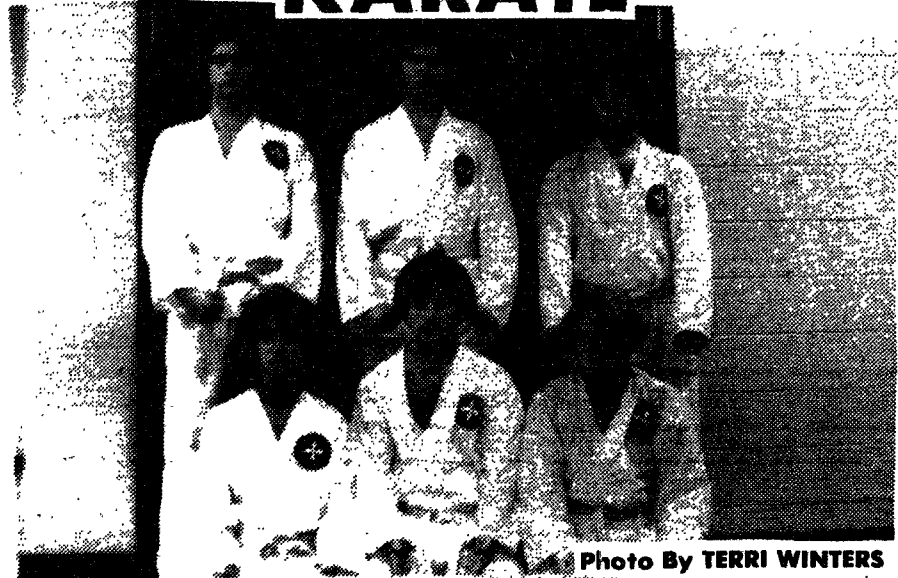
