Geo. Closes Stronger

Delmarva closed fully steady with 740,800 head selling Friday at 16-16.8. Week's total volume was 3,501,300 with range running mostly 16-16.9.

Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for week ending July 17 was down to 3.4, with broilers averaging 16.85 and feed at \$99.54. This compares with the year-ago ratio of 4.0 with 19.73 broilers and feed just 34 cents higher.

Georgia closed higher, with 1,327,000 head moving Friday at 15-15.9, compared with 14.5-15.9 range for Thursday and 14.5-15.2 range last weekend. Week's volume totaled 10,117,000 head, with estimated slaughter for the weekend at 1.88 million.
