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State's June
Milk Output
Hits Record

Milk production in Penna.
during June has been esti-
mated at 623 million lbs.,
down eight per cent from
May, but two per cent above
June, 1958. This is a record
for June and the fourth con-
secutive record month for
1959.

Production for the first six
months of 1959 totals 3,521
million lbs. or about one per
cent above the 1959 yield.

With the advance of warm
weather and reduced pas-
tures, production per cow
for the month, at 676 lbs.,
showed a nine per cent seas-
onal decrease from the 746
lb May average.

However, June's rate still
was a monthly record 3%
above the per-cow aver-
age for last June. The num-
ber of milk cows on Pa
farms is holding steady at a-
bout 921,000 according to the
Crop Reporting Service.

Average price Pa farmers
received for milk in June
was \$4 35 per cwt, unchang-
ed from May and the same
as June, 1958. Feed prices
declined a little in June
making the milk-feed ratio
a little more favorable than
last month and last year.

The price of cows held at
\$305, with fluid market milk
at \$4 40 and manufacturing
milk, \$3 65, down from \$3-
70 for May and June, 1958.

Feed prices were 16%
protein - \$3 70, 20% protein
- \$3 90; 29% protein and over
- \$4 35, 44% soybean
meal - \$4 20 bran - \$3 10
Alfalfa hay, baled - \$30 50,
and other baled hay - \$24 40.

The Milk-feed ratio was
1 29, up from May's 1 28 and
June, 1958 1 25, as the num-
ber of pounds of dairy ration

Elverson Cow
Tops Red Rose

"Anna", registered Hol-
stein cow owner by John
Stoltzfus, Elverson RD 2,
topped the Red Rose DHIA
June records with a 305 day
lactation completion record
of 16,819 lbs of milk, with
680 lbs of butterfat from a
4 0% test.

Second high Red Rose in-
dividual record was complet-
ed by a registered Guernsey
owned by Raymond and Lou-
ise Wiemer, Willow Street R.
D 1 "Dolly" produced 13-
876 lbs of milk, 664 lbs of
butterfat with a 4 8% test in
305 days.

The herd of C Richard
Landis, Lancaster R D 5,
had the highest butterfat av-
erage. This 23-cow herd av-
eraged 1641 lbs of milk, 62
lbs of butterfat with a 3 8%
test for the month.

The 19-cow herd of Hiran.
S Aungst, Elizabethtown R
D 1, placed second with an
average of 1573 lbs of milk,
59 lbs of butterfat, also with
a 3 8% test.
