**To School Directors, Supervisors, and Collectors.**

The Commissioners of Beaver County would earnestly call the attention of the above named officers to the following sections of an act passed in 1850:

Relating to the sale of Lands for the non-payment of Taxes.

Section 2. That from and after the passing of this act, assessors, supervisors, and collectors of road and school taxes, be, and they are hereby required to make their returns for the collection of all taxes on unentered lands, on or before the first day of January in each and every year, and if not so made, by said assessors and collectors, such returns shall not thereafter be received, nor shall such taxes be levied on real estate: Provided, that this section shall not be construed to exempt said assessors and collectors, and their heirs, from liability for not making their returns according to law.

Section 3. That it shall be the duty of supervisors and collectors of road taxes, and of all collectors of any other taxes whatever, to make return to the County Commissioners of any exhortation claimed by them, on or before the first day of January in each year; and it shall be lawful for the said County Commissioners to grant any exhortation fitting that time, nor for the County Treasurer to make any funds which shall have been returned and taxes exacted, after the said time.
