represent an investment of over a quarter million dollars, Mr. Noll said.

Equipment purchased in order to provide the raw material includes new power shovels and 11 new trucks.

Installation of the crusher has been a two-year job but it is expected to begin operation by July 1. Thus the plant will achieve its highest productive capacity in 46 years of operations.

The newly reopened Whiterock quarry at Jacksonville was put in operation last week, he added. At present this job is operating six days a week and about 11 carloads of stone are shipped daily from the Whiterock tipple and siding in Howard Shiptons area.

In addition, about five carloads of "fines" are processed for use as highway stone.

This new operation employs 20 men, 17 of them being new employees. It represents an investment of \$100,000, the general manager reported.

It was pointed out that Whiterock is changing its entire type of operation. Power shovels at the main operation load the stone from the five quarry openings. This once required the services of 400 men. Now 75 are employed.
