EX GOVERNOR William F. Packer died at his residence in Williamsport on Tuesday last, in the 61th year of his age. In his youth he was a printer and editor. He was Canal Commissioner under Gov. Porter and appointed Auditor General by him in 1812. He was Speaker of the House of Representatives, in 1847 and 1848 and elected Senator in 1849. In 1857 he was elected Governor which closed his official career.

A young man named Detrick, a barber, of Harrisburg, shot and severely injured two ladies, a Miss White and a Miss Casey, near Camp Curtin, on Friday last. Detrick is in jail, but alleges that the shooting was the result of accident, while evidences goes to show that the shooting was done deliberately. The gun was charged with No. 7 shot. One lady loses an eye, and both were severely wounded about the face and neck.

INTERNAL Revenue taxes producing nearly \$25,000,000 a year ceased on Saturday last. This is in addition to taxes heretofore removed, which produced annually \$170,000,000. It is in addition also to a further reduction of \$50,000,000 of taxes provided for at the last session of Congress and to be made 62 or before the first of

next May. And this is but the beginning. The interest burden has been reduced \$18,350,000 since last year. Expenditures are decreasing. The month just closed showed \$9,009,498 taken from the public debt, making the total decrease in nineteen months of Grant's administration nearly one hundred and eighty millions of dollars. This as the result of economy, efficiency and honesty of Republican rule. On the other hand, wherever the Democratic party is in power, taxes increase. In New York city, alone, the local taxes have grown over \$7,000,000 in a single year. The elections are impressed by the contrast and will approve of the reduction of the national taxes by sustaining the Republican party at the polls.

NEWS IN BRIEF.
The fiftieth amendment gives Pennsylvania 6,475 voters. The State contains a negro population of 57,849.
Within the coming fortnight 1,200 Treasury clerks will go home from Washington to vote.
E. D. Mansfield, the distinguished statistician and writer, is the Republican candidate for State Senate in Butler and Warren counties, Ohio.

Nearly all the candidates on the citizens ticket, Oil City, have withdrawn, leaving a clear field to the Republican ticket, which, by the way, is a first-class one.

The Massachusetts Woman's Suffrage Convention resolved to chatechise all candidates and to support none not in sympathy with the women; it endorsed Wendell Phillips, but refused to nominate him.
