WASHINGTON, Dec 14. Memorials were presented by Messrs. Conkling and Sherman, representing that many of the veterans of 1812 are now inmates of poor houses...

The House resolution for a recess over the Christmas holidays, from December 22 to January 4, was concurred in—aye, 36; nays, 16.

The bill to provide a relief fund for employes in the executive Department of the government was reported with amendments by Mr. Sherman...

Mr. Drake good humoredly indicated a modification of Mr. Davis' amendment to the effect that prohibition should come as soon as the Democratic party come into power.

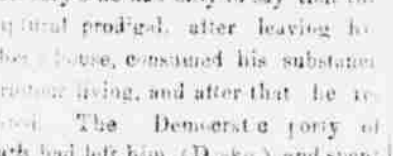
