Township and Borough Accounts.

-The Legislature last winter amended the act relative to publishing the township, borough and school district accounts so as to fix definitely the time of the publication of these accounts. The borough, township and road statements are to be published in April, "the end of the fiscal year," and the school accounts in June which closes the fiscal year for school pur-

SECTION 6. The corporate authorities of every such municipality or district shall at the end of their fiscal year, prepare and publish in at least two newspapers of said municipality or of the county in which the same is situated, if so many be printed therein, a statement showing in detail, the actual indebtedness, the amount of floating debt thereof, the valuation of taxable property therein, character, and value thereof, and the

date of maturity of the respective forms of funded debt thereof, and a neglect or failure so to do shall be a misdemeanor, punishable by fine not exceeding one thousand dollars. Approved the 12th day of April 1875.
