CABINET CHANGES.—The President on Monday last sent to the Senate three nominations that have attracted deserved attention. Judge Pierpont, Attorney General, is made Minister to England; Judge Taft, who has been Secretary of War for a time, succeeds Mr. Pierpont; J. D. Cameron, son of Senator Cameron of this State, is named for the vacant Secretaryship.

THE NEW GAME LAWS.—As there are numerous inquiries by sportsmen in regard to the new game and fish laws, we condense the following from the somewhat lengthy report: Deer may be killed from the 1st of October to January 1st; gray, black and fox squirrels from August 1st to January 1st; woodcock from July 4th to January 1st; partridge or quail and rabbit from October 15th to December 15th; pheasant from October 1st to January 1st; trout and salmon from April 1st to August 15th; black bass from July 1st to March 1st; and only with rod, hook and line. The bill imposes a penalty of \$25 for killing, catching or discharging any firearms at any wild pigeon while on its nesting ground, or in any manner disturbing such nesting ground; a fine of \$5 for killing any insectivorous bird, and a fine of \$25 for hunting and fishing on Sundays.
