—Chicago, 20.—About 2 o'clock yesterday morning a fire broke out in the Walton House, on East Washington street—a not too reputable locality—and from room 45, where the smoke was thickest, the agonizing screams of a woman were heard.

—New York, Aug. 20.—United States Marshal Knox yesterday sent a communication to chief of marshals of the election districts in this city, requesting them to meet at his office on next Thursday to make arrangements for preparing the list of special marshals who acted at the Presidential election of 1880.
