

CALIFORNIA NEWS.

PROMETHEUS. ELEVEN DAYS LATER FROM CALIFORNIA.

The steamship Prometheus, with California dates to San Juan de Nicaragua, with California dates to February 1st, arrived at New York, on Saturday morning, with 324 passengers and \$32,000 on freight.

The U. S. sloop-of-war Albany, Captain Platt, sailed, on the 9th inst., from San Juan for Havana.

John B. Weller has been elected U. S. Senator. The vote on the last ballot was seventy-one in favor of Weller. Major Reading received seventeen votes.

The Tennessee sailed from San Francisco on the 1st of February, with 320 passengers and \$1,000,000 in gold for Panama.

The Alta California makes the following summary of news for the two weeks:— No business of importance has been transacted by our State Legislature since the session commenced.

Gov. Bigler has issued a special message, touching the financial affairs of the State, in which he urges upon the Legislature the early adoption of measures to relieve the burden of the State's liabilities, and exhibits the amount of her indebtedness.

The Settlers and Miners' Convention, as the several meetings held in Sacramento recently, to discuss the subject of land and claims in general, have been called, all meetings with little sympathy as ever.

All was quiet at San Diego at the last accounts. Troops had gone to the Gila, and no further disturbance was expected with the Southern Indians. Company F, 31st Infantry, with Major Andrews, has gone to the mouth of the Colorado. Provisions have been sent, and a depot is to be made at the mouth of the Gila and Colorado.

In the mines, much inconvenience and loss has been experienced, by the failure of the water supplies. Digging has not been very brisk, and prospecting parties have been few, but few discoveries within the month. The laborers have worked out a water, and are disposed to "stay by," sitting for more. Since Thursday they have returned, and copious showers have fallen in the interior. This will revive spirits in the mines.

A bill had been introduced into the Senate, authorizing the Governor of the State to be authorized to actual settlers on ranches. The bill, bearing the stamp "S. M. (Standard mint value)" in California "S. M. Messrs. Moffatt & Co., have to similar issues.
