ADULTERATION OF DRUGS .- At the commencement of the present session of Congress, a report from the United States Surgeon-General was presented, from which it appears that the adulteration of drogs and medicines is carried on more extensively in the country since the passage of the act of Congress to suppress the importation of such articles, so that it is now alleged to be difficult to procure medicines which are not either mixed with some foreign substance. or from which some portion of the active principle has not been substracted by chemical process. Thus it would seem that the effort to suppress the foreign trade has resulted in imparting an extraordinary stimulus to the home manufacture of the spurious commodities.
