PENNSYLVANIANS IN THE BATTLE AT GETTYSBURG.—Pennsylvania had a large share in the late battle at Gettysburg, and the blood of her sons was freely shed in her defense. The three senior Generals were Pennsylvaniaans, and the immediately following division shows that at least fifty Pennsylvania regiments were in the fight. The 11th Pennsylvania, the 1st, 2d, 3d, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th Reserves, the Pennsylvania battery, the 23d, 29th, 56th, 62d, 63d, 68th, 69th, 71st, 75th, 82d, 83d, 88th, 90th, 91st, 93d, 98th, 99th, 105th, 106th, 107th, 110th, 114th, 115th, 121st, 139th, 140th, 141st, 142d, 143d, 145th, 147th, 148th, 149th, 150th, 151st, 154th, 155th. Other regiments from the State no doubt participated in the battle, which was won by steady valor and discipline on the part of the men, who were well aware that the fighting was on their own soil, and for the protection of their own homes. Though much is due to the brave officers and men engaged, the skill and generalship shown in the disposition and maneuvering of the troops by the general-in-chief is not, and never will be, forgotten.

The "St. Catharine's Journal" says that on Saturday night, the 26th instant, with a sound louder than the discharge of a park of artillery, a large section of the rock on the north or Canada side of Niagara Falls, near Mr. S. Davis's Table Rock Hotel, fell into the abyss below, giving the falls on this side a more decided horse shoe appearance than they had before.

LATEST NEWS.

FBI'LATEST FROM NEW YORK.—Andrews the leader of the rioters was captured with his black cohort in a house of ill-fame.—5000 sabres and 100 muskets were captured from the mob. The mob has been severely handled by the military. The New York 7th Regiment is at home. A regiment from Buffalo and one from Michigan also arrived.

Lee's losses were put down at 42,500.

At Port Hudson 7000 prisoners, 60 guns and 10,000 small arms were captured.

CHARLESTON.—Gen. Gilmore has captured nearly all of Morris' Island with 11 heavy pieces of Ordnance, and prisoners, camp equipment, &c.

The riot at Boston was soon put down.

The Northern Central road is now open for travel through to Baltimore.

ROTH at DANVILLE.—We learn that a serious riot commenced at Danville on Thursday, and some the day before. Application was made to the Governor for aid to suppress the mob.

Local Affairs.

THE HARVESTING.—Our farmers are busy with their harvest and haymaking. The recent rainy weather had interfered considerably in the gathering of the crops, but we do not think the grain has been much injured in this quarter.

ED Some half a dozen of our citizens who paid a hurried visit to the battle field on Gettysburg returned on Sunday morning last. A number of the dead rebels were still unburied; these together with hundreds of dead horses, made the air reekent with field smell.

ED Court. There will be but one week's Court commencing on the first Monday of August. All civil cases are postponed, and jurymen for the second week will not be called to attend. The first week will be consumed mostly with criminal trials.

ED The small log house occupied by Peter Huey in Lower Augusta township, was consumed last Friday by fire, caused by the stove-pipe through the roof.

ED Divine service will be held by the Rev. J. H. Young, in the Presbyterian Church, in this place, tomorrow (Sunday) at 10 o'clock A.M., and 3 o'clock P.M., and at Northumberland in the afternoon.

ED The fitting up the tents work above town on the Philadelphia & Erie road, with earth, and the making of a stone culvert, has been allotted to Mr. Miller. It requires about 10,000 yards of earth, which will be a great improvement and one much needed.

ED The Knights of the Golden Circle, Toledo, Ohio, July 6.—The Knights of the Golden Circle broke open the depot at Huntington, Indiana, at about two o'clock, this morning. They opened two or three boxes of guns and ammunition and distributed the contents among themselves.
