The Secretary of the Treasury gives notice that

subscriptions will be received for Coupon Treasury

Notes, payable three years from August 15th 1864,

with semi-annual interest at the rate of seven and

three tenths per cent. per annum—principal and

interest both to be paid in lawful money.

These notes will be convertible at the option of

the holder at maturity, into six per cent. gold bear

treasury bonds, payable not less than five nor more than

twenty years from their date, as the government may

direct. They will be issued in denominations of \$50,

\$100, \$500, \$1,000 and \$5,000, and all subscriptions

will be for fifty dollars or some multiple of fifty

dollars.

The notes will be transmitted to the owners free of

transportation charges from the receipt of the

original Certificates of Deposit as they can be

prepared.

As the notes draw interest from August 15, persons

making deposits subsequent to that date may pay

the interest accrued from date of note to date of

deposit.

Parties depositing twenty-five thousand dollars

and upwards for these notes at any one time will be

allowed a commission of one quarter of one per cent.,

which will be paid by the Treasury Department upon

the receipt of a bill for the amount, certified to by

the officer with whom the deposit was made. No

detections for commissions must be made from the

deposit.
