the samples as follows:
These three packages were cut in the same field, at the same time, and treated alike, until drawn into the barn. All were moint, in fact too moist. The two packages with bright appearances are taken, one from the side and one from within the mow, of fifty-two feet length, eighteen feet width and fourteen feet high. 
