

Recipes, &c.

Medical.

APPLIES.—Take well flavored apples, parboil, and boil till tender, but not to break in pieces. Add sugar to the taste, and let the whole boil up once or twice. Fill the jars and seal.

ANOTHER RECIPES.—Halve and core ripe and tender apples, fill the jar, pour in syrup till the jar is half full, place in a boiler of cold water, boil ten minutes—if there is a vacuum fill the jar with hot syrup—after taking a short time to settle seal as before directed.

Peaches.—Select fine, ripe peaches; pare them; cut them in halves, and take out the stones; put them in water as soon as pared, to retain the color; fill the jars with peaches packed as closely as possible, add syrup till the jar or can is half full. Place in a vessel of cold water and boil 10 minutes, and seal up hot. When wanted for use pour off the water; cut the peaches in a dish and sprinkle with sugar an hour before wanted, same as fresh peaches.

QUINCES.—This fruit should be sliced and boiled in water till tender, then fill the jars or cans, add the hot syrup and seal as directed.
