MANNER.—An ordinance for the establishing of a granite market in this place, passed the Council on Thursday evening last. The ordinance will go into force on the 4th of October next.

IMPROVEMENTS AT GEORGEVILLE.—Our enterprising friend John Blumgarn, Esq., is about completing a fine brick building in that place which will be a fine addition to the town. STORY.—On Sunday evening about half-past ten o'clock, a house on the corner of Front and Walnut streets, owned by T. C. ANON.—On Tuesday morning between four and five o'clock, the shed roof over J. B. Lenker's brick kiln caught fire from a burning kinsel. The alarm was given by the blowing of whistles of incendiaries, when a large number of citizens emerged from their houses and hurried to the scene of conflagration. The steam engine fire company were promptly on the ground, and did splendid execution with their apparatus, and saved at least several thousand dollars worth of property. The shed was almost entirely consumed. Mr. Lenker's loss will probably reach several hundred dollars.
