good market raspberry.

But we suppose that the past winter has given a death-blow to the reputation of all hardy raspberries. Even the blackcap in the fence-rows have been injured in many instances, and it will not be surprising if such usually hardy ones as Philadelphia and Herstine suffer this year. This will give a new claim to the protecting idea; and if protection, then the finer kinds. It is more than likely that the injury to

the canes by the winter, will result in short crops, both of the blackbery and raspberry, and that high prices will be the conse-quence. Of late years these have been so common as to be within the reach of hundreds who hardly knew them by name be-fore, but if our anticipations of scarelty prove correct, the strawberry will yet re-

main the poor man's fruit.

In the planting of raspberries there is one hint which may be of service to raspberry planters, and that is not to set the plants too deep. More die from this cause than people have any idea of. The raspberry canes should be cut off to about one foot, and not set deeper than an inch above where the roots are. The earth must, of course, be pressed very hard and firm against the sets, when thus planted, or else they will soon dry out. Some use mulch to shade the ground after the raspberry cane has been planted, but if pressed firmly in the earth they will not suffer from the weather, unless extremely dry, and do much better than with the mulch on the surface the first year .- Germantown Tele-

Pruning at Transplanting.

At this planting season it may not be amiss to observe that most trees will be benefited by a little pruning at the time of planting. In saying this we know it is opposed to the teachings and the practice of some excellent fruit-growers who have succeeded very well in transplanting without using a kulfe on the tree from the first to the last. But an extended observation shows us that in most cases with people this good result, would not follow. If the roots were always in good condition. were not allowed to get dry before planting, there might be no great benefit in the pruning, but it is very rarely the case that this good condition of the roots is secured.

It is sometimes said that the whole mass of wood in the transplanted tree is necessary to furnish the downward sap necessary to form roots; but those who have

sary to form roots; but those who have carefully watched the operation of root-making, have, no doubt, seen that roots

Call at the Large and Bea are most rapidly formed while the tree is growing most vigorously, and now leaves and branches are forming. To get a good, rapid, new growth, therefore, is a means of getting roots, and this rapid growth is encouraged, in a strong degree, by pruning at transplanting.

How much should be cut will depend on

the amount of roots already existing and the kind of tree to be planted. An apple tree, for instance, seldom requires much, because the roots are naturally fibrous, and in digging the tree there is always a good proportion of roots to it. The same is true of a dwarf pear, as a general thing; but a standard pear with a few forklike prongs in the place of roots, or an oak with a similar sat of hornlike projection - , the place of fibrous roots, is always it defited by a considerable quartity of the younger twigs being taken off after the young tree is set out. - Germantown Telegraph.

CURE FOR ROUP OR GAPES .- A gentle man who had several valuable fowls with roup asked a well-known chicken fancier for a remedy, when he was informed that the most effectual cure was to cut off the heads of the fowls as soon as the disease made its appearance. Unwilling to lose valuable fowls without making an effort to save them, he commenced to treat them af-ter a method of his own. He placed his diseased fowls in a perfectly dry room, bathed their heads with kerosene oil and rubbed their bills inside with a mixture of alum and grease. He fed them only on Indian meal and boiled potatoes well-peppered with cayenne, no hard food whatever being allowed them. With this treatment they commenced to improve, and in from a week to ten days had entirely recovered. The disease has seldom failed to succumb to this treatment. On an average only about one chicken in six died.

SPREAD YOUR MANURE. - The common practice, when hading manure from the yard to the field, is to deposit it in small peaps of from one to two feet in thickness. In this condition fermentation, to a certain extent, takes place, and a great proportion of the growing elements of plants existing, are dissipated into the air and lost. If over each heap so left, a peck of plaster (gypsum) could be sprinkled, as the heap was deposited, this loss would be saved but in the absence of this gypsum, to hold the effervescing ammoniacal ether-the ground work of plant life-it is better to distribute the manure at once over the land; for when so spread out no heat or evaporation ensues, and at each and every rain, or dew, the best elements are dis solved and conveyed into the ground.

How To MIX MUSTARD.—Mustard should be mixed with water that has been boiled and allowed to cool; hot water destroys its essential properties, and the raw, cold water might cause it to ferment. Put the mustard in a cop with a small pinch of salt, and mix with it, very gradually, sufficiently boiled water to make it drop a spoon without being watery. Stir and mix well and rub the lumps down with the back of a spoon, as mustard properly mixed should be perfectly free from these. The mustard pot should not be over bulf full, or rather less if it will not be used for a or two, as the mustard is so much better when fresh made.

GOOD WASH FORTHE TRETH .- Dissolve two ounces of borax in three pints of boiling water, and before it is cold, add one table spoonful of spirits of camphor, and bottle for use. A teaspoonful of this mixture, mixed with an equal quantity of tepid water, and applied daily with a soft brush, preserves and beautities the teeth, extirpates all tartarous adhesion, arrests decay, induces a healthy action of the gums, and makes them look pearly white.
