Nearly all income tax money has seen turned in from the Harrisburg internal revenue offices to the head es at Lancaster.

As a rule there was not much diffi-culty in getting the tax money, al-though the local offices had to serve several special warrants upon delin-quents. When these were forthcom-ing there was no further hitch, or, at least, hasn't been to date.
