The Sun says it is worthy of notice, as illustrative of his notions of gentility, that, on his arrest for fe'ony, semething being said of the affray of the previous evening, he asked the officer who the person he had struck was. He was informed that he was a young man much respected, and the son of a bookbinder in this city. "A bookbinder !" exclaimed Poaler, "only a bookbinder ? Why, I really thought he was a gentleman, or 1 should not have quarrelled with him." On hearing this, a wag remarked that the difference was decidedly in Hickman's favor, he being a bookbinder and the other a highbinder.
