

Cabinet Is Apex Of Campus System Of Gov't, Politics

As on most college campuses, student government at State closely follows the national system of political organization.

At the top of student administration are the All-College officers and All-College Cabinet, governing body of the various campus groups.

Three All-College officers, along with the senior and junior class officials are elected in the Spring. Freshman and sophomores are elected in the Fall. The All-College president presides over Cabinet meetings, and the workings of student government on campus. The class officers are concerned primarily with their own classes, but the president of each class has a seat on Cabinet, and the treasurer of each class is a member of the Interclass Finance Committee, with the All-College treasurer as chairman.

Also seated on Cabinet are presidents of each of eight school councils, presidents of Panhellenic and Interfraternity councils, Women's Student Government Association (WSGA), Women's Recreation Association (WRA), chairman of the board of publications, board of dramatics and forensics, Athletic Association, Association of Independent Men (AIM) and Leonides, independent women's organization.

It is the boast of Penn State student government that each student is represented at least four times. Each student is represented by the president of his class, the president of his school council, the chairman of either the men's or women's athletic association, the president of either the fraternity or sorority councils or the independent organizations. 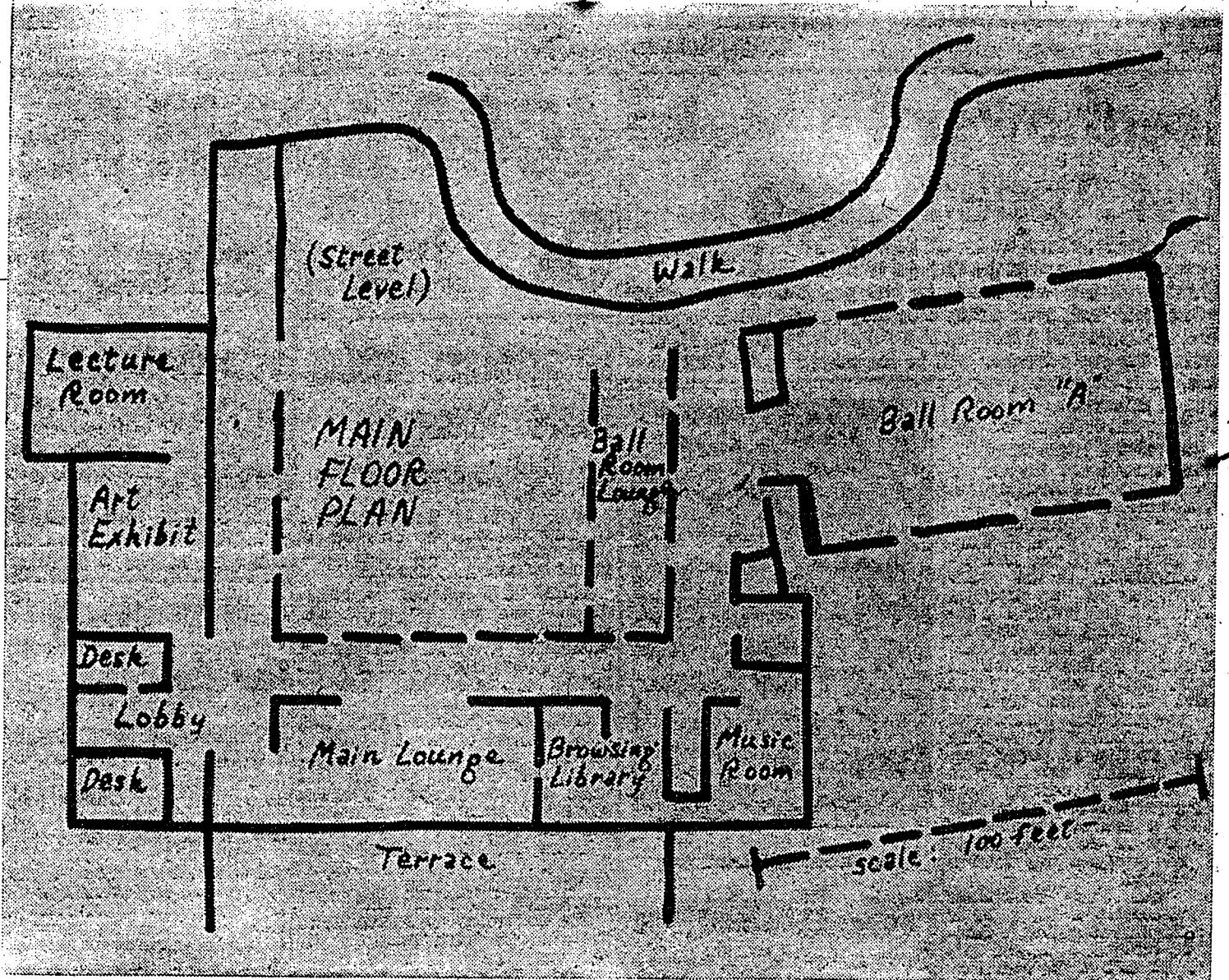
One of the most important of the standing committees of Cabinet is the All-College elections committee. This committee has the task of running elections, counting ballots, and setting up the elections code in which factors such as election platforms, election procedures and campaigning are dealt with.

Cabinet committees are required to report at intervals to Cabinet on the progress of their work, and special committees are appointed to deal with situations which cannot be covered by the standing committees.

Urges Attendance

Wilmer E. Kenworthy, assistant to the president in charge of student affairs, has urged new students to attend all meetings scheduled for them during Orientation Week. Meetings are planned for their informational value, he said.

Deadline Passes For Removal Of Bars

Yesterday was the deadline for removal of bars from fraternity houses as decreed in June by the then acting president, James Milholland. Rumors have persisted since the order was handed down that bars do not actually have to be removed from the houses but no longer can be used.

Daniel DeMarino, assistant dean of men, last week pointed out that the order specifically states that "the College does not permit the establishment of bars, or their maintenance in the residence or headquarters of any fraternity, rooming house, society or other student organizations and all existing facilities shall be removed by September 10, 1950."

DeMarino and Wilmer E. Kenworthy, assistant to the president

in charge of student affairs, said that special dispensations will be allowed in cases where it is physically impossible to remove the bars, or impractical for other good reasons to remove the bars during the specified time limit.

Kenworthy, however, pointed out that fraternity houses all were notified previously that in the case of such circumstance that would prevent the house from complying with the order, the dean of men's office should be notified.

He said that in such cases, if the dean of men is not notified, the house necessarily will be subjected to disciplinary action. Revocation of the house charter will be considered if the case warrants it, Kenworthy said. He did not elaborate on other

disciplinary measures that might be taken.

In relation to the drinking situation, State College Police Chief John Juba recently issued a warning to adults and minors in State College concerning the serving of alcoholic beverages to minors.

Juba, in a letter to the Daily Collegian and the Centre Daily Times, stated that three minors have been arrested and fined \$25 plus costs each, the minimum fine, for violating a State College borough ordinance. The law states that a minor is subject to two fines when he enters a place displaying a "no minors allowed" sign and purchases or consumes alcoholic beverage. The maximum fine for each offense is \$100 or 30 days in jail.
