

Dinks And Bows Appear

For the first time since 1945, freshmen entering Penn State are subject to a full set of customs and regulations. Customs go into effect the first day of classes.

Last year saw the first freshmen on campus in five years but, since the "class" was made up of just 500 women, an abridged form of customs was adopted.

Women's rules this year are divided into true customs, which end three weeks after the opening of school, and regulations, which continue for longer periods. No limit has been set for men's customs; they will be removed by action of All-College Cabinet.

Enforcement of customs is the task of Tribunal, men's student judiciary body, and Judicial, its feminine counterpart. Hatmen and women also are especially charged with enforcing customs.

Illegal Hazing
Tribunal chairman Neil See emphasizes that freshman men can turn in to Tribunal names of upperclassmen guilty of illegal hazing.

All charges of breaking customs are to be written, signed, and placed in a special box for Tribunal at the Student Union desk. Persons to appear at hearings will be notified by Tribunal.

Dress customs have been set up for both men and women. Men will wear green dinks to be sold at the BX, black bow ties, and four-by six-inch name cards for the first week, then

urdays, and do not have to wear them at all on Sundays. Ribbons must be worn to all football games throughout the season.

Men's dating customs will be observed throughout the customs period, all day, every day. There will be no dating or association with women within three miles of Old Main.

Women will not date or associate with men anywhere during the first three weeks of the semester. During this time, they must be in the dormitories by 9:15 o'clock week nights and 9:30 o'clock Saturdays and Sundays.
