



Foreign architecture study set

A foreign studies program at the University of Leeds in England will begin Spring Term for University architectural engineering majors.

Howard Kingsbury, associate professor of architectural engineering, developed the program, which is the first engineering program sponsored abroad by the University.

Fifteen students have been selected to participate in the 12-credit pilot program this year. Kingsbury said a regular student exchange with the University of Leeds is being considered for future years.

The specialized program is designed to enrich professional training of prospective architectural engineers through exposure to foreign practices involving the environmental and structural design of buildings.

Courses offered include Architecture 316, Architecture 443, Architecture 403 and Architecture 442. The program is open to architectural engineering majors of at least fourth-term standing.
