



Newspaper union chief to speak

The president of America's largest newspaper union is scheduled to speak on campus tonight. Charles Perlik, president of the Newspaper Guild, will speak on "The Future of Newspaper Unionism" at 8 p.m. in 112 Kern. The lecture, which is open to the public, is sponsored by the Penn State Society of Professional Journalists, Sigma Delta Chi. Perlik was born in Pittsburgh, and received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the Medill School of Journalism at Northwestern University. Perlik worked as a reporter for the United Press in Pittsburgh and Chicago and for the Buffalo Evening News. He went to work for the guild in 1952, first as international representative and then as secretary treasurer. The Newspaper Guild currently is striking the Philadelphia Inquirer and Daily News.

Shop window broken by tossed brick
