The unexpected assault of Beast Butier upon Bingham, of Ohio, in the House of Representatives, wherein he ecclared that Mary E. Surratt was innocent of the crime for which she was ex. conted, and that Bingham knew it, took the world by surprise, although the asvertion did not astonish any person who is at all conversant with current history.

That Mys. Surratt was foully murdered to subserve political ends, no one who is at all sincere now denies-but that Butler should be the one to bring the neousation reginst a political col. league to whom he is bound by the cohesive power of public pluuder, was scarcely to have been expected.

The revelations made by the Benst show up concentrat of the secret Listory of the case, but do not yet reveal who was aiding and abetting John Wilkes Booth in the killing of the " late bamented," or who, perhaps, was the instigator of the crime.

Rutier's assortions in regard to Booth's diary remain undisputed-for Bingham's assertion that he knew nothing of it, that he did not cut out the missing leaves, only amounts to a donial that he was purflexpe eviadade, that he was not party to the suppression of the evidence. -the only evidence, it may be, which could throw a gleam of light upon the real facts of the death of Abraham Lincolu.

Taking a political view of this quarrel, a very pretty one as it stands, it affords pleasure to every true lover of his country, as proving that, cover up their petty dissensions as they may, the dissordent elements of which the present party in power is composed will eventu. ally cause its downfall.


