The South has made efforts to turn the stream of immigration in that direction, as we learn from the Times, which announces that the statesmen of the South, "represented by Governor Orr, of South Carolina, are addressing themselves to the people of Europe, in the hope of scenring something from the tide of emigration which annually sets in from Ireland and Germany. Virginis has an accredited agent in London for this purpose. Tennessee is about sending one there, sundry parties are laboring in the interests of Louisiana in that market, and South Carolina has within the month sent a special commis. sioner abroad, charged with this very important duty. So far as we are in-formed, South Carolina, urged and aided by Governor Orr, is in the van of this movement, and is preparing to make systematic endeavors in the line of settlements."
