Joseph R. Ingersoll; was admitted to practice in 1831, and has served two terms in the Legislature of the State. In 1845 he was appointed Judge, and in 1848 President, of the District Court of Philadelphia; and when the Constitution was changed in 1851, and the judiciary became elective; and in 1851, he was elected by the people without an opposing candidate, the unusual honor of a nomination by both of the great political parties having been conferred upon him.
