GRACE CHURCH.—This edifice is about being completed, and we as a journalist, take it upon ourselves to give our readers a brief description of it. The building is located on Centre street at the head of Mill street. The architecture is Gothic; on the northeast corner is a spire 90 feet in height, with a compartment for a belfry, in which we understand, it is the intention to put a bell during the present winter.

The painting, graining and calcimining was done under the personal supervision of Mr. Wm. P. Williams, and is a master piece of workmanship.

The architect and builder, Mr. Mars-ton, certainly deserves praise for the prompt and efficient manner in which he has done his work. The ground for the foundation was broken on the 25th of July last, and the carpenter work commenced on the 27th of August, and now, on the 19th of December, we have a church.

Our community owe a debt of gratitude to the ladies of Ridgway for their efforts in raising funds in various ways to go towards its completion and erection. We learn the dedicatory services will take place on Christmas.
