Democratic State Convention. HARRISBURG, PA., Jan. 8, 1868.

The Democratic State Committee of Pennsylvania have fixed WEDNESDAY, the FOURTH (14th) DAY OF MARCH, 1868, at 12 o'clock a. m., as the time, and the Hall of the House of Representatives, at Harrisburg, as the place for holding the annual Convention of the party.

It is ordered that this Convention be composed of one member for each Senator and Representative, who shall be elected in the usual manner and they will meet at the time and place above said, for the purpose of nominating candidates for the offices of Auditor General and Surveyor General, and of selecting delegates to the National Convention for the nomination of candidates for President and Vice-President.

The members and committees of the organization and all conservative citizens who can unite with us in the support of constitutional principles are requested to proceed to the election of the delegates in their respective districts.
