Although Masteller is retiring in June, he will continue his research and plans to conduct studies in Costa Rica. Masteller also plans to submit articles on two other insects discovered in Puerto Rico.

Masteller and his students will present seven papers or posters at the Pennsylvania Academy of Sciences meeting April 2-3. The presentations are based on research conducted at Presque Isle and stemmed from Masteller's invertebrae zoology class last year. The research, which is on invertebrates, was videotaped and will be used in some biology classes.

To conduct this research, Masteller and his students studied specimens they collected as well as specimens collected over the past fifteen years. Some students have developed hypotheses stemming from the research. "It's interesting to find odd species that don't seem to fit in," said Suzanne L. Confer, a senior biology major. "I want to continue research."
