Hot off the press: Dr. Lilley receives a copy of the *Tempus*, Behrend's literary magazine, from the editor, Jennifer Wilson. It publishes short stories, essays, poetry, and photos by students. An editorial committee accepts submissions during the fall and spring semesters. The publication will be on sale in front of the library in Reed for \$3.00 each. The sale runs from April 20 through April 22 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Several hundred so-called Deadheads could be released from federal prison soon if the U.S. Sentencing Commission votes--as many expect--to change LSD sentencing laws. Because of a quirk in sentencing rules that punishes LSD offenders more harshly than other drug offenders, violators caught with small amounts of LSD received long prison terms. Currently, sentences are based on the weight of the inactive material--paper or sugarcubes--that the LSD is placed on. The proposed changes would relate sentencing to the amount of LSD involved. The change has been proposed because the weight of inactive substances varies so wildly and so does LSD sentencing: five doses on sugar

cubes can get the same 10-year/no parole sentence as 50,000 doses of pure LSD. Also, reports last year revealed that the LSD laws targeted Deadheads, who often live hippie lifestyles and use LSD openly. Of those LSD offenders jailed in federal prisons, more than 80% are Grateful Dead fans. Another 1,000 to 4,000 Deadheads are in state prisons and will not be affected by a change in federal law.

At a Glance...

Jury deliberations in the Rodney King civil rights are expected to begin this weekend and authorities are preparing for public reactions to the verdict. In Los Angeles, up to 6,500 police officers will be on the streets. National Guard armories are prepared for deployment, curfews have been proposed, and temporary bans on ammunition have been instituted. This preview was given by Mayor Tom Bradley and Police Chief Willy Williams Tuesday of the city's plan to quell possible violence after the verdict is released. "We're not going to fail you this time," said Williams. "You will have all the officers on the street between the time the jury starts deliberating and the verdict."
