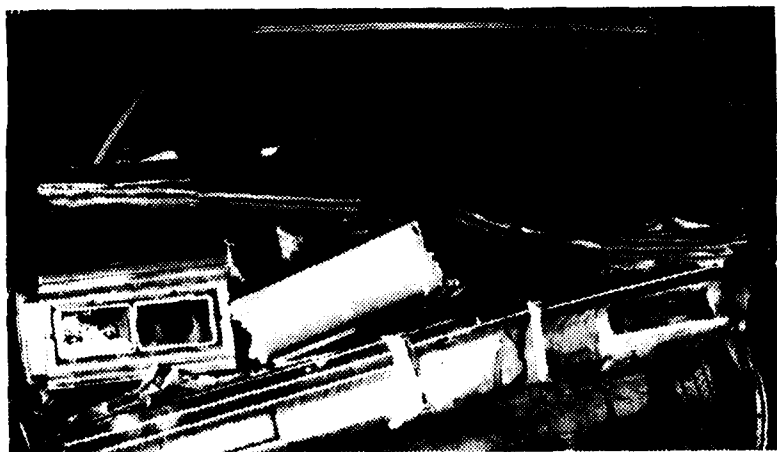
hour of their time and a description of what they do.


