Religious Views Differ

I am writing this in response to John Rossomando's most recently disturbing article, "Being a Christian."

Rossomando states, "Do not try to analyze the word of God with your small human minds because it is like a blind man trying to read printed words on paper."

My earliest memories of my parents date back to when they were still marijuana-smoking hippies. I would bring my fiveyear-old friends over to play, and




