Dr Dean R. Baldwin, associate professor of English, will speak on "Your Stories, My Stories, Our Stories" Tuesday, March 29, as part of the Behrend College Provost's Speaker Series.

The lecture will begin at 8 p.m. in the Reed Lecture Hall. It is free and open to the public.

Baldwin is the recipient of the 1992-93 Penn State Behrend Council of Fellows Faculty Research Award. The award was established in 1982 to recognize the faculty member who is recognized by his or her peers as best fulfilling the role of "a dedicated, inspired researcher."

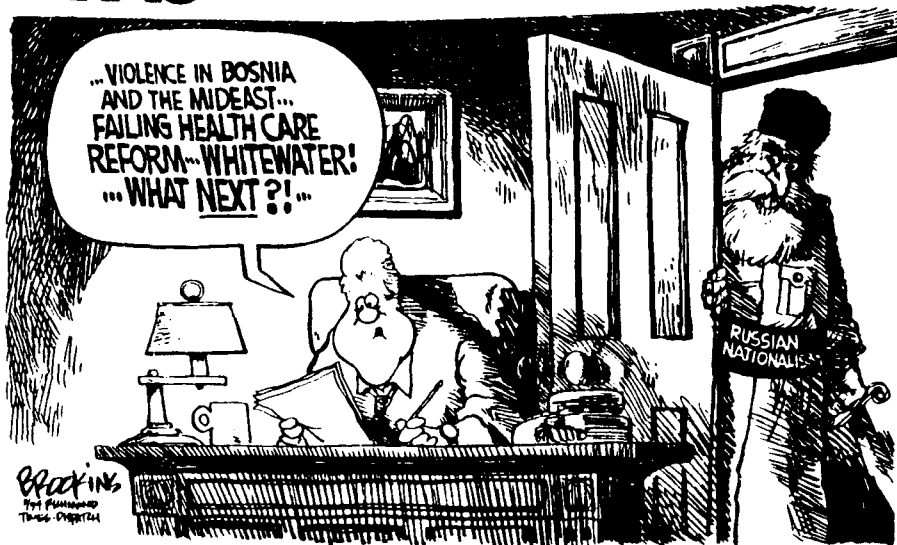
Baldwin earned his Ph.D. from Ohio State University in 1972 and taught at Yankton College in South Dakota before coming to Behrend in 1975. His interest in the British short story grew out of research for a biography, "H.E. Bates: A Literary Life", and continues in his books, "V.S. Pritchett" and "Virginia Woolf: A Study of the Short Fiction."

Two more books, an annotated bibliography of the short story in English co-written with Dr. Gregory Morris, a Behrend associate professor of American literature, and "The British Short Story, 1945-1980", are scheduled for publication this year.

Measuring an earthquake

The Richter scale is the best known scale for measuring the magnitude of earthquakes. How to read the scale:

EARTHQUAKE'S FORCE	POSSIBLE EFFECTS
<p>Cubes represent quake's force at various magnitudes</p> <p>A magnitude 7 quake is 100 times stronger than the explosion of a one-megaton bomb underground</p>	<p>Amount of damage also depends on how close the quake is to a city and how well the community is built.</p> <p>7.0 100 times stronger than 5</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Conspicuous cracks in ground Masonry and wood structures seriously damaged Danger of large landslides <p>6.0 10 times stronger than 5</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> People have difficulty standing, steering vehicles Chimneys, stucco and masonry walls crack Pipes break, danger of fire <p>5.0</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Everyone feels the quaking Houses shake, glass breaks, furniture slides, objects fall
