A multi-meter was reported stolen from the Otto Behrend Science Building.

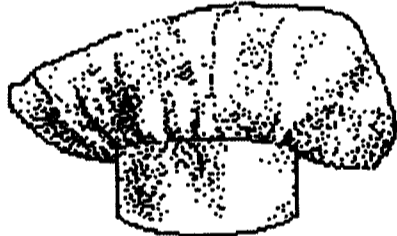
