Nese describes Mary Wilhelm's contribution on the fifth and final goal as "a great individual effort with hustle."

Wilhelm provided the assist to goal scorer Becky Eckendorf, who is usually the Behrend goalkeeper. The netminder, while playing a forward position, scored her first goal of the season.

"We accomplished what we set out to accomplish this season. In the process, we gained the respect of some varsity coaches," Nese said.

The Lady Lions lost to Grove City by scores of 15-9 and 15-11, then later in the day succumbing to Westminister by scores of 16-14 and 15-11.

Carrie Grzejka and Mitzi Carter each pounded out 11 kills in dual match play. Molly Samuels led Behrend in digs with 20, while Angela Georg dished out 31 assists.

Head Coach Jan Wilson was disappointed with her team's play over the dual match with Grove City and Westminister.

"We just came out awfully flat. Our back row played really well. We had 90 digs over both matches, but our hitters just didn't put the ball in play."
