

# Christmas concert *Police and Safety Report*

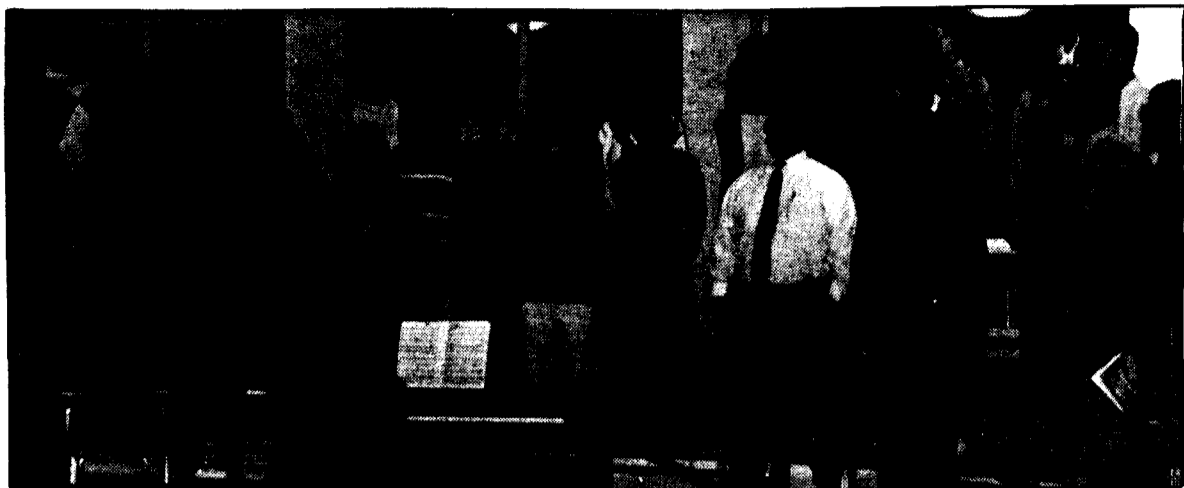

literature of the Western United States. The interview system became established when Morris talked with his first author in New York.

"It then became a matter of contacting other authors and interviewing them. In most

cases I met with the authors in person; only a few were answered in writing."

Morris said, "production of the work took five to six years, from the first interview to publication." He did the bulk of the work, which included transcribing tapes and editing, in

the last four years.
