

Banderas, DeMornay heat up screen

Strangers: Sarah (DeMornay) begins a passionate affair with Tony Ramirez (Banderas) which threatens her fragile way of life.

TRISTAR PICTURES-- Dr. Sarah Taylor (Rebecca DeMornay) is a criminal psychologist with a brilliant incisive mind. She is capable of dissecting the fabrications of accused serial killer Max Cheski (Harry Dean Stanton), who is attempting to avoid a murder trial through an insanity plea.

While shopping for groceries, Sarah meets a stranger -- the charming, enigmatic Tony Ramirez (Antonio Banderas), whose fiery combination of innocent and danger succeeds in breaking through Sarah's emotional walls.

She begins a passionate affair with Tony, an experience that is both exhilarating and frightening to someone as controlled as Sarah.

As a new life unfolds for her, a series of increasingly disturbing events threaten to destroy it. Someone has left dead flowers on her doorstep and frightening

messages on her answering machine.

Then someone kills her beloved cat.

Sarah is terrified. Who can she trust? Her mysterious new boyfriend, Tony? Her devious patient, Cheski, who has been released from prison through a lack of evidence? Her possessive next-door neighbor Cliff (Dennis Miller)? Or even her own estranged father, Henry (Len Cariou)?

Never Talk to Strangers star and executive producer DeMornay concurs, "The film is sexy but it is also very psychologically intricate. Everybody in the film comes under suspicion. It's a very plot-driven suspense thriller."

There are three love scenes in the story, all of which are very different. One is about finding trust. Once is about absolutely, unleashed passion and one is about tenderness and

understanding, a genuine start to love.

Sex is crucial to the story because the central character DeMornay plays is a psychologist who's an absolutely brilliant person professionally at sorting out other people's problems, but not at all good at sorting out her own.

Agrees DeMornay, "My character is someone who is very emotionally restrained at the

beginning, who decides to take a great risk: falling in love. It may be one of the greatest risks for anybody, because you're risking the core of yourself. I think the movies' core is about trust and betrayal of trust and the rage that comes from that."

Veteran character actor Stanton plays Max Cheski, the man whom Sarah becomes professionally involved with.

"I think Cheski comes from a

society that's full of rage," he says. "Every human being in this society is suppressing rage. We can all relate to that, but I think it's too difficult for most people to fact it."

The movie's plot is thick leaving the audience on the edge of their seat.

"Everybody's a stranger in *Never Talk to Strangers*," says Miller.
