### WPISC all-stars announced

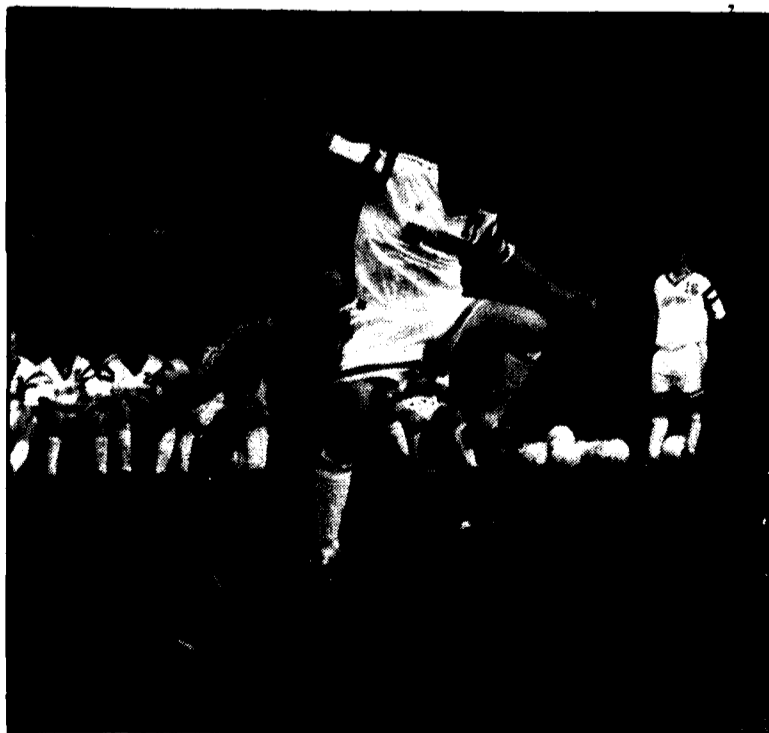
