Freshmen more a factor for the Lions

The Penn State-Behrend men's basketball team has not changed in the past week. One night, the Lions win by 11, the next night

they lose by two, and then Behrend drops a game to Washington and Jefferson by five points.

The swapping of wins for losses finds Behrend currently

standing at 11-10.

Monday, the Lions traveled to Washington, Pennsylvania, to meet the Presidents of W&J. Despite having a 44-32 halftime lead, Behrend could only muster 19 second half points as they fell to the Presidents, 68-63.

Jason Paloskey led the offensive attack with 15 points. Andy Lawrence followed with 11 points, four rebounds, and three assists.

Lions now stand at 11-10 for the season.

Jeff Myers rounded out the double digit-scorers for Behrend with 10 points.

The floor certainly fell out on the Lions, as Behrend only shot 29 percent from the field in the second half.

This tasted especially bad after the Lions shot 64 percent from the field in the first half.

Saturday, the Lions hosted the Warriors of Keuka College (8-13). Behrend got trenched 59-57.

Ron Derian and Lawrence were the only Lions in double figures as Derian netted 13 points and Lawrence aired 10 points.

Lawrence also battled for teamhigh honors in rebounds with seven, and assists with three.

Myers ended with nine points, but the 6'6" freshman was held to zero rebounds.

Wednesday, Behrend Last clashed with LaRoche College on the road. The Lions roared with a 72-61 victory.

Myers led the Lions with 14 points and five rebounds.

Derian, Paloskey, and Anthony Costantini all followed with 11 points each.

Derian and Costantini each finished with a team-high six rebounds, while Paloskey did not miss a shot from the field (fivefor-five).

During these last three games, Behrend has struggled from the free throw line (53 percent during that stretch), especially in the second half (49 percent).
