Emotional sniper attempted suicide

UNIVERSITY PARK - Friends and acquaintances paint a bleak picture of Jillian Robbins, arrested in Tuesday's shooting at Penn State's University Park.

On the condition of anonymity, acquaintances said Robbins had a history of mental problems and had once spent time in a hospital.

A friend said that during the past year, she was married and divorced and had tried to commit suicide last month. According to another friend, she seemed particularly depressed in the last week and had tried to commit suicide last month.

Daughter of a Harrisburg Campus professor and US Army Reserve coordinator, Robbins' marriage license said she went no further than the 11th grade in school. She had hoped to become an artist.

Former co-workers of the woman with a purple mohawk called her "Crazy Jill," an acquaintance said.

Robbins who shot two students, killing one, knew none of her victims, said David Stormer, assistant vice president for University

She was well acquainted with guns -- according to Stormer, Robbins had Army Reserve training and a friend said she liked to

Equiped with a 7mm high-powered rifle with a telescopic sight at University Park, Robbins will face charges for opening fire on students leaving their 8:00 a.m. classes Tuesday morning.

this mode," Spanier said. "Parents can be confident that this is still a safe environment."

The only other campus slaying in Penn State's history was in 1969 when graduate student Betsy Ruth Aardsma of Holland was stabbed in Pattee library. The assailant has never been identified.

Spanier promised that the investigation will continue and the University will provide necessary counseling, psychological and other services as needed.

Behrend Provost and Dean Dr. John Lilley said that his first reaction to the incident was that of a parent.

"I reacted to it first as a parent. Just the thought that one of my children may have had to go through that," he said.

He said that he worried that people may get the wrong idea about University Park and think that it is a dangerous place. However, Lilley said that people need to consider that the campus is safe and this is only the second incident in 150 years.

"It is a human tragedy from beginning to end. It is a tragedy for her life as well as the student who died and the one sne [allegedly] injured," he added.
