A great weekend for alumni and current students, there is something for all to enjoy at Homecoming '96.




Student dies in 10-story fall

A 19-year-old University student died Tuesday morning after apparently jumping from a 10th story dormitory window, University Police Services said. A student discovered Kurt Kristian Stenman's body on the sidewalk beneath an open Pinchot Hall window at 10:25

a.m. Tuesday. Police said they suspect Stenman (freshmanarchitecture), of 316 Atherton Hall, jumped from the window between 10 and 10:15 a.m. Police have not yet ruled his



death a suicide or an accident.

Director of University Police Services Tom Harmon said the window was not broken after the incident.

"It looks to me like the screen is still there," Harmon said. "It's just pushed out."

Centre County Coroner Kerry Benninghoff will continue the investigation and has scheduled an autopsy for today to determine the cause of death.

Stenman, a 1996 graduate of South Western High School in Hanover, was in the top 5 percent of his graduating class. said Dr. Michael Clemens, the superintendent of the school district.

A person close to the family said Stenman did not have a job and was not involved in any clubs at the University.

"He was just a freshman," she

said. "He was just starting to feel his way."

Saeed Faridzadeh (freshmanarchitecture) said Stenman was very devoted to architecture.

"He was possibly one of the best students we have here," he said.

Faridzadeh said he was working with Stenman on their architecture projects the night before the incident.

He said Stenman took a break around 1:30 a.m., and the two of them laughed as they listened to an Adam Sandler compact disc.

"He didn't seemed depressed or anything," he said.

Faridzadeh said he was shocked after he learned Stenman was found dead.

"It was Kurt," he said. "It couldn't be Kurt."

Stenman was also a member of the University Scholar's Program. Some of Stenman's other classmates said he was quiet, but always nice in his classes.

"He talked a lot and contributed a lot.

He wanted to participate," said Erica Sterzinger (freshman-liberal arts), who had a political science class with Stenman. "But, his tone of voice was quiet."

Sterzinger, who split the cost of their political science book with Stenman, said she didn't know her classmate well. But she added most people didn't have the opportunity to meet Stenman because the year just began.

Stenman was the son of the Rev. Eric Stenman and the Rev. Joanne Stenman of St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Hanover.

Stenman's death was the second on campus (University Park) this semester.

Two weeks ago, on Sept. 17, Jillian Robbins allegedly opened fire on the HUB lawn and killed Melanie Ann Spalla, 21.
