

Lions get ninth win of season

The Penn State Behrend Men's Soccer team continued its success this year by winning its school

record ninth win en route to a 3-1 drubbing of LaRouche.

Matt Kapral scored two goals and Ryan Croyle scored one for the Lions.

Coach Perritano seemed happy about breaking the school record for wins, but declined to discuss its significance.

"We'll look at it at the end of the year," he said.

The Lions are still ranked in the NCAA Division III poll in the northeast, and have a great shot at the post-season with four games remaining on the slate for the 1996 campaign.

Perritano refused to take credit for the team's breaking of the record and solid season this year saying, "we accomplished a goal collectively and

"He has a positive attitude toward the game and is always willing to learn" said Coach Dan Perritano.

Coach Perritano was speaking of his new scoring machine and Housing and Food Service Athlete of the Week Matt Kapral.

Kapral a transfer student from the University of West Virginia has help lead the Behrend soccer team to a record breaking nine wins this year.

On Saturday, Matt led the Lions to a 3-1 victory of LaRouche. He accounted for all three Behrend goals by scoring twice and collecting an assist on the final goal.

Kapral scored two goals in the first five minutes before recording an assist in the 37th minute of play vs. LaRouche.

Hall of Fame

On October 26th Penn State Behrend will be recognizing eight individuals into their athletic hall of fame.

Joe Fornear graduated in 1982 with a Bachelor of Arts in Communication. Fornear, an ex-member of the baseball team, holds the record for most home runs (15) and runs batted in (77).

Joe Hansen, also a baseball player, holds the record for batting average in a single season at .484 and doubles in a career (24).

Kathleen Hansen, wife of Joe and three sport athlete at Behrend, captained basketball,

softball, and volleyball. In 1983, she led the conference in kills in volleyball.

Another standout at Behrend, Craig Hill, will be inducted into the hall of fame for his all-star tennis performance from 67-69. Hill was undefeated in singles and doubles for Behrend in 1969.

John Robert Hoge was a Behrend student from 1971-75, and a member of the soccer team. In 1971 he was captain of the commonwealth championship team, and in 1972 he led the team in goals with 10.

Dennis H. Hoover went to Behrend for two years before transferring and he participated in soccer. In 1967 he led the team in scoring.

Robert J. Jeffrey also excelled at soccer for Behrend. Between 1970-73 he started every game for the Lions and in 1973 he was elected to the West Penn All-Star Team.

The seventh and final inductee is John Zahniser. Zahniser is an honorary inductee who went on to medical school after Penn State Behrend. He is currently employed as a neurosurgeon.

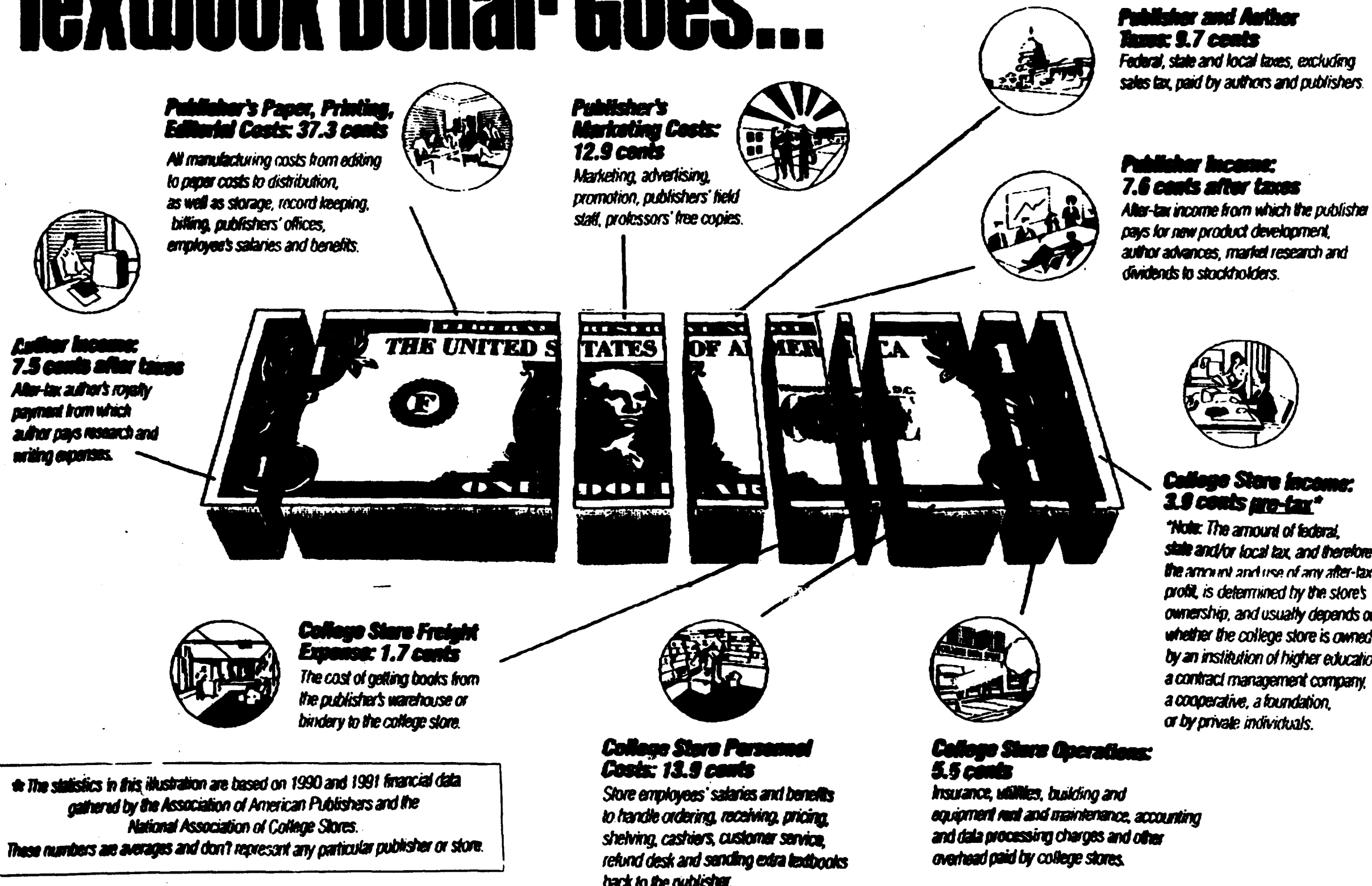
