One of which came as a conference victory against Pitt-Bradford.

In the other two games, Behrend defeated Keuka by a score of 4-3, and took a tough loss to Case Western, 3-2.

The team's first game came as Behrend traveled to Pitt-Bradford.

Travis Lang opened up the scoring for the Lions with a goal on a penalty kick in the opening minutes of the game.

Pitt-Bradford scored the next two goals of the contest to take the lead in the second half.

Josh Castillo tied the score for Behrend with a goal in the 54th minute.

"We played tough in the second half because of Coach

Dan's motivational speech," said freshmen Chris Lightner.

The crucial point of the game proved to be the game winning goal by Chris Lightner in the 60th minute of the contest.

"We really turned up the effort in the second half of the game," added Chris Kennelly.

Goal keeper Thomas Seig added 10 saves in the victory.

On Saturday the Lions traveled to Keuka for an independent contest.

Behrend came away with the victory by a score of 4-3.

Travis Lang once again opened the scoring for Behrend in the 6th minute of play.

Ryan Croyle then knocked in a goal to make the score 2-0 in the 10th minute.

Keuka proceeded to then score three unanswered goals to take the lead in the second half.

Croyle scored his second goal

of the game to knot the score at 3-3.

The score remained tied throughout regulation.

In the 90th minute of overtime, Thomas Helmkamp came through

with the game winning goal for Behrend.

"Our physical play and determination in overtime forced some turnovers. We were able to get a lucky break in Helmkamp's goal," said Chris Kennelly.

"Winning the two games on the road, is a positive step in reaching our goal of winning the conference championship," said coach Perritano.

## Webster joins Behrend athletic family

Jeff Webster became head athletic trainer of Behrend after serving four years at Gannon under the same position.

The week of September 21-28 is an important week for area athletic trainers. For the second consecutive year, Athletic Trainers in the Commonwealth will be recognized for their efforts in the field of sports medicine.

"It's a change of pace, something a little different," said

Webster of the move to Behrend. Webster has also been assistant athletic trainer at Erie Community College in Buffalo.

The Athletic Trainers' primary responsibility is maintaining the safety and health of all physically active Pennsylvanians in the Commonwealth, including over 224,000 PIAA high school athletes, several thousand college athletes, and over 12 million other physically active residents.

Webster, a Gannon graduate and former golf star for the Knights, is replacing long time trainer Richard Boesch.

Athletic Trainers across the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania will be celebrating by having receptions at colleges and universities that have a major in Athletic Training.

"I like the college atmosphere, the thought of moving up enticed me four years ago. Now I'm

settling in, found where I want to be," said Webster. "I enjoy working with college students."

Athletic Trainers are not personal trainers at the health club and do much more than just tape ankles.

Athletic Trainers encompass five major domains; prevention of injury, recognition, rehabilitation, health care administration and professional development and responsibility.

There are over 15,000 Athletic Trainers in the nation, 1,100 of these are nationally Certified Athletic Trainers are in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Pennsylvania also has the greatest number of accredited athletic training education programs in the country. Fourteen of the 100 accredited institutions are found in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
