### Men's soccer team drops heartbreaker to Buffalo

The Behrend men's soccer team suffered a crushing defeat on Monday dropping their season record to six wins and three losses.

The Lions traveled to Buffalo State to face a struggling program with a one win and four-loss season, only to watch their own promising season start to fade.

An overall record of 6-3 is anything but bad considering the Lions have 18 new players, but the players and coaches will not rest on past achievements.

Fabrizio has a near perfect singles record at 6-1 and a perfect doubles record of 2-0.


"We've pretty much dominated the conference this year, first as a team and now Gabby and Jo Ann are scooping up all the individual honors," said Keenan.
