The first victory came on Saturday against LaRoche and gave Coach Dan Perritano's troops momentum heading into Sunday's action versus Frostburg State.

Sunday's battle against Frostburg State was much more than just another game. The winner of the game came away with the first AMCC regular season women's soccer title and earned the right to host the conference tournament.

The Lady Lions came away with an impressive 3-0 win. Senior Lara Herrman, freshmen Jill Barbisch and Katie Giles each beat the Frostburg goalie for goals to lead Behrend's offense.

The defense was led by Mary Ann Rupp, who recorded the shutout. The win was the Lady Lions eleventh of the year.

Saturday's game matched Behrend up against a solid LaRoche team. The Lady Lions were able to come away with a 2-1 victory.

Senior Michelle Finch scored Behrend's first goal while Barbisch

Thanks to the two victories, the Lady Lions finished the AMCC regular season with an undefeated record. "It is really exciting winning the conference for the regular season," said Jill Barbisch.
