Sandy Mishic who placed twentieth with a time of 19:55 led the women's team to a thirty-sixth place finish out of forty-three teams.

Mishic's twentieth place finish earned her the honor of being named to the All-Region team. She missed qualifying for Nationals by five places.

"It was disappointing for Mishic to miss Nationals, but everyone that finished ahead of her ran at least twenty seconds better than her best time and making All-Region is a great accomplishment," Drew
