Men's basketball team drops nailbiter to Pitt-Bradford 69-63

The Penn- State Behrend men's basketball team took a hard fought loss to AMCC conference foes Pitt-Bradford Wednesday night by a score of 69 - 63.

The loss drops Behrend's record to 6-4, while moving their AMCC conference record to 0-1.

The game was wire to wire throughout the contest, before Pitt-Bradford slowly pulled away in the last twenty seconds of the game.

Behrend took a 31-27 lead into half-time, before being outscored 42-32 in the final half to lose the game.

"We just didn't seem to get any breaks in the key moments of the game," said senior Matt Plizga.

"We played hard. They are a veteran group that play very well together. They made a lot of good plays tonight. We just need to get

healthy," said head coach Dave effort were Brock Bovaird with 14 each pulled down 6 rebounds in the Niland.

Speaking of getting healthy, the Lions have been playing without leading scorer Andy Lawrence, who was averaging 15.6 points a game, wirile also pulling down 6.2 rebounds. Lawrence, who is out with a bum ankle, is expected to be back in the lineup sometime in the near

The biggest problem of the game for the Lions seemed to be guarding Pitt-Bradford's Pat Culliman, who bagged 6 of 9 three-pointers, to finish with a game high 22 points.

Leading the Behrend scoring attack was Brian Emick, who finished with 16 points, 7 rebounds, and 3 steals.

Also contributing to the offensive

points and 2 steals, and Nate Wilson, who finished with 10 points and 6 rebounds.

"The only good thing about this game is that we get to play them again later in the year," commented sophomore John Park.

Over the holiday break, the Lions played five games in which they came out of with a 3-2 record.
